

1000 Books Before Kindergarten

Research shows that reading books and sharing stories with your child is one of the best ways to help them enter school with the language skills they need to be ready to learn and grow.

Here's how to participate:

- Pick up your Reading Log at the library.
- Write down all of the books that your child reads or is read to them. Include stories that your child hears at storytimes, at preschool/daycare, etc.
- Bring the completed log back into the library, pick up your prize, and get the next reading log.
- If you read 4 books a week, your child will have read 1,000 books in 5 years!
